Make time





Keep it simple

Because the amount and complexity of trial information can be overwhelming for patients, HCPs should avoid medical jargon and explain options in easy-tounderstand language.



Overcome

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To deal with a lack of time on their part, HCPs should offer resources to help inform patients about clinical trials.

Be a knowledge seeker

Stay on top of current clinical research by reading medical journals, attending conferences, and networking with colleagues.

Build upon the doctorpatient relationship by holding an honest, open discussion about the available options.
