Trial Summaries provides an unbiased and non-promotional portal for sponsors to share Clinical Trial information such as summaries of protocols, results, journals and other relevant information, with participants and public.

It's the law

- Under EU Regulation 536/2014, sponsors must provide summaries of study results that are understandable to the general public.
- This requirement is recognized by the World Medical Association, the Pharmaceutical Research and Manufacturers of America (PhRMA) and the European Federation of Pharmaceutical Industries and Associations (EFPIA).
- Guidance and recommendations are provided by the Multi-Regional Clinical Trials (MRCT) Center and TransCelerate.

It's best practice

Trial sponsors face ethical, organizational and legal obligations to communicate trial results to participants. Best practices dictate that study information should not have a commercial or marketing appearance, and that the summaries are made available in a non-promotional context.

It's time- and cost-efficient

Paper-based distribution at study sites can be costly, time consuming, unreliable and hard to track. As a result, trial participants often don't receive valuable study information.

Because the portal includes summaries from multiple sponsors, those studies are seen by a broader audience than ones posted on a sponsor's website alone.
